President's Message

Bylaw Changes

The Board of Directors has two topics to bring before the membership for your consideration:

- Electronic Voting In order to take advantage of technology and be more responsive in our decision-making process, the Board of Directors would like to amend the bylaws to allow voting by electronic means. Currently, business that requires a membership vote can only be done once per year at the annual business meeting or through the regular mail. This change will allow the board to conduct business that requires a membership vote through a secure electronic process.
- ASCLD/LAB Ex-Officio In May of 2013, the ASCLD board voted to remove the ASCLD/LAB Ex-Officio position from the board. In January 2014, the new board, after having surveyed the membership, revisited the topic. The Board's feelings remained unchanged and the membership appeared to be approximately evenly split, at least according to our survey data. Thus, we seek your input in the form of a vote to help decide the issue.

This measure is simply the number of Cases completed for each full-time equivalent (FTE) employee (the work input of a full-time employee working for one full year) retained by the laboratory in the investigative area of **DNA**. It gives an indication of the level of productivity within the average laboratory by investigative area. This information is derived from those laboratories who participated in the 2011-2012 FORESIGHT program.
