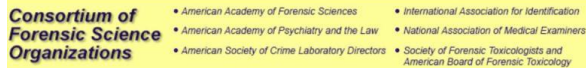

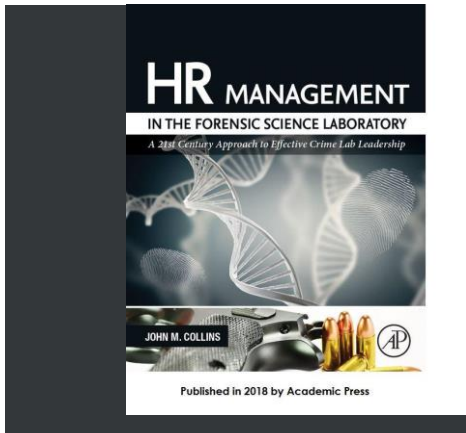
[Special Edition - Opioid Bills](#)

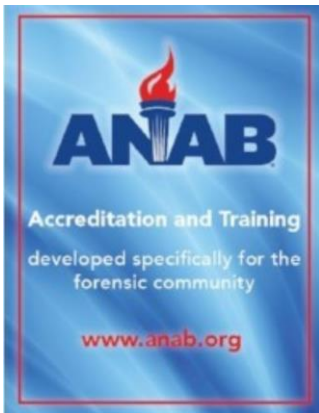
